The Cannon Mills Company was an American textile company founded by James William Cannon, based in Kannapolis, North Carolina. It was founded in 1888 and went bankrupt in July 2003. The Cannon brands were then purchased by the Iconix Brand Group . Cannon Mills was purchased four times, and had four names.

The community became the quintessential "company town" of Kannapolis. A 1928 consolidation of nine textile plants into the Cannon Mills Company helped the business survive the Depression. Cannon continued to add to its family of mills throughout most of the twentieth century, buying such companies as Maiden Knitting Mills (1969), Wiscassett Mills Company (1978), and Beacon Manufacturing (1978).

Cannon Mills In 1906 J.W. Cannon purchased the land that later became Kannapolis, and acquired a total of 1008 acres in Cabarrus and Rowan Counties. Approximately 808 of those acres of farmland, purchased along the historic wagon road between Salisbury and Charlotte, became the location of the new textile mill, Cannon Manufacturing.

Stories From An American Mill. James W. Cannon founded the town of Kannapolis around his mills. The Cannons lived in neighboring Concord. James Cannon died. His son, Charles Cannon, took over the operation of the company. In June, a textile strike was called in Concord and Kannapolis. After 2 months, when they knew the strikers had run out of food, Charles Cannon and the Mayor of Concord called in the state militia to reopen the mills.

The Cannon Manufacturing Company, which became the largest producer of towels in the world, and Kannapolis, sometimes known as City of Towels, stood as the capstones to Cannon's career. Cannon was married on 24 Nov. 1875 to Mary Ella Bost of Concord.
